Having passed through various towns in Navarre, the *Cultural and language diversity* on the Route of Santiago exhibition was inaugurated on September 8 in the Pedagogical Museum of Galicia, in Santiago de Compostela. The General Secretary for Language Policy of the Xunta of Galicia, Anxo Lorenzo, attended the event and declared that "pilgrims who travel along the Route do not do so in an impervious manner. Along their journey they share, learn, communicate and, little by little, fill their backpacks with new experiences, cultures and languages". "This travelling exhibition is an attempt to bring visitors closer to this diverse blend of colours that makes up the Route of Santiago, and it does so in an enjoyable way by inviting them to participate and reflect on linguistic and cultural diversity".

The exhibition is looking to promote and strengthen the diversity of European languages and cultures, particularly the minor ones, taking some of the languages that are spoken in the territories through which the so-called French Way passes as its central axis.

The *Cultural and language diversity on the Route of Santiago* fair began its journey in Pamplona/Iruña last July 16 and continued through Orreaga/Roncesvalles and Puente la Reina before arriving at Santiago, where it will stay until November 15. The last stop of the exhibition will be in Kiel (Germany), from November 22 to December 22.
